- 8. The next day, the dragon was still there, warming its tail on the chimney-pot.

 And no one in the house dared to stick so much as a finger out of doors.
- 9. "We can't go on like this!" cried the merchant's wife. "Sometimes dragons stay like that for a thousand years!"

- 10. So once again they waited until nightfall, but this time the merchant and his family crept out of the house as quiet as could be. They could hear the dragon snoring away high above them, and they could feel the warm breeze of his breath blowing down their necks.
- 11. By the time they got half-way across, they were so frightened that they all suddenly started to run. They ran out of the gardens and off into the night.
